



**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN  
THE LEGAL EXECUTION DEPARTMENT OF THE MINISTRY OF JUSTICE  
OF THE KINGDOM OF THAILAND ON COOPERATION  
AND  
INTERNATIONAL UNION OF JUDICIAL OFFICERS (UIHJ)  
IN THE SPHERE OF CIVIL JUDGMENT ENFORCEMENT**

The Legal Execution Department (LED) of the Ministry of justice of the Kingdom of Thailand and The International Union of Judicial Officers (Union Internationale des huissiers de Justice – UIHJ) (hereinafter referred to individually as a “Participant”, and collectively as the “Participants”), wishing to strengthen further, academic cooperation between the Participants in the sphere of civil judgment enforcement, have concluded this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as “the Memorandum”) about the following:

1. Subject to the fundamental principles of the Rule of law, the law, rules and regulations under which the Participants are obligated, and their respective nations’ public policy, as well as the UIHJ’s public policy, the general objective of this Memorandum is to stimulate and facilitate cooperation between Participants in the field of civil judgment enforcement.

2. The Participants shall cooperate in any relevant aspects and by any appropriate means.

3. The purpose of this Memorandum is to establish a basis for academic cooperation on the following areas:

3.1 The exchange of academic information and experience on improvement and development of civil judgment enforcement systems.

3.2 The exchange of academic information and experience on issues of legal support of judicial officers’ activity, monitoring law implementation and the improvement of legal regulation(s) in the sphere of civil judgment enforcement.

3.3 The exchange of experience on issues of technical support (including software and computing) of functions’ civil judgment enforcement.



3.4 The exchange of academic and professional information and experience relating to their activities in teaching and training in the field of civil judgment enforcement.

3.5 The exchange of officers and legal expert for sharing experiences on solutions difficulties and challenges in the field of civil judgment enforcement as well as the improvement of the efficiency of the judicial officers' activity, through research, reconnaissance visits and training.

3.6 The promotion of appropriate joint projects and joint training courses

3.7 The organization of conferences, seminars and training courses in the fields of civil judgment enforcement.

3.8 The exchange of publicly available legislation, legal periodicals and publications in the fields of civil judgment enforcement.

3.9 Other directions by mutual agreement of the Participants.

All cooperative activities under the Memorandum will be carried out with the financial availability of each Participant.

In the implementation of specific cooperative programs, a written agreement covering all relevant aspects, including the funding and the obligations to be undertaken by each Participant will be negotiated, mutually agreed and formalized in writing, prior to the commencement of such program.

4. The Memorandum is not an international treaty, and does not create rights and obligations regulated by international law.

5. Any divergences arising with respect to the implementation of the Memorandum are settled amicably through consultation between the Participants.

6. The Memorandum may be supplemented or amended by mutual consent of the Participants. Such supplements and amendments are an integral part of the Memorandum.

7. The Memorandum comes into effect from the date of signing and will remain effective for a period of three years.

After the specified period, the application of this Memorandum is automatically extended for subsequent three-year period. Any Participant may terminate the application of this Memorandum by giving written notification to the other Participant six months before the end of the latest period. In this case, the application of this Memorandum is terminated after thirty days since the date of such notification.



The termination of the application of this Memorandum will not affect the activities and projects already under way.

Signed in Paris on 20<sup>th</sup> November 2025, in duplicate, each in Thai and English languages, all texts are equally authentic. In the event of a divergence of interpretation, the English language text will be used.
